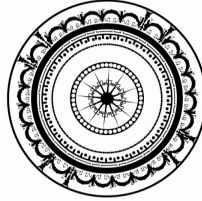

Bidding Prayer Emily Hull McGee

UPDATE MEETING ON FUNDING PHASE I OF BUILDING PROJECT

With our anticipated cost of the project at just over \$5.4 million, our Finance Committee has been hard at work drafting plans to fill the gap which currently stands at \$1.6 million.

As a follow up to all the campaign effort and to keep with our desire for full transparency, the Finance Committee and campaign leadership invite you to an informational session to hear the options and plans for our financial path forward to fully fund Phase 1 of our building project. We are a church that is richly blessed and extremely fortunate to have such a strong financial footing. Come hear more about our financial plans, as we move forward in to 2019 and live in to our vision of becoming "a community in the heart of the city called by Jesus to practice bold love of God and neighbor and boundless compassion for all people."
